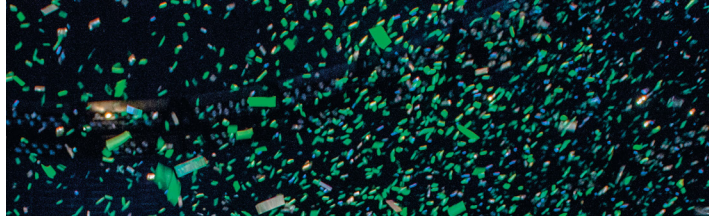
Dean's Message

RESEARCH STATS AND ACCREDITATIONS

The Tulane University School of Public Health and Tropical Medicine is accredited by the Council on Education for Public Health (CEPH) for its bachelor's, master's, and doctoral programs.

Accreditation was last awarded in October, 2017 for a seven-year term, extending to July 1, 2025. The school has been accredited since 1947.



ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS:

A bachelor's degree from an accredited institution of higher learning.

Academic achievement – typically a GPA above 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS:

Online MPH in Community Health Science students will apply through a Fastlane Application. This allows for quicker acceptance decisions and does not require letters of recommendation.

In addition to the online application form, the requirements for the application consist of:

Official Transcripts

- Must be sent and received by a university representative.

A minimum of two letters of recommendation should illustrate your characteristics for success in community health sciences graduate study.

One-to two-page written statement detailing your interest in the Community Health Online MPH program and how it relates to your future professional goals.
